## They call it Stormy Wednesday

**F**OUR games in three days in (mostly) scorching sunshine was on offer for softballers playing or guesting on Tuesday and Wednesday and in the single-sex on Thursday. ## Drizzle fightback washes away Colt 45s in mid-table shootout

MOVING swiftly on from the soul-sapping experience of a sixth-inning shellacking at the hands of the Hackers, Drizzle pulled a similar trick—albeit less spectacularly—on the Colt 45s. The soggies thus seized control of the bottom half of Division 4 in a second entertaining one-point thriller this season between two evenly matched teams.

WITH only Emma Waterhouse's dazzling home run in the sweltering heat of the first 3½ innings, both defences had put in solid efforts to limit the scoring to 3-2, aided by a number of miscued hits sighed straight to shortstop. The revolvers blew a hole in the sea-mist's defence with a well hit home run from Tadgh Tobin over right centre, triggering some improved hitting from the home side. Top gun and male MVP Phil Cosgrove repeated the trick later, giving the Colt 45s a 9-4 lead at the bottom of the fifth.

EVERYTHING changed at the top of the sixth. Rallying around a sniper shot triple down the first base line by male MVP Tim Roberts, Drizzle completed a full rotation of the batting order for the first time in 2015 having finally got to grips with some cunning flat pitches from the pistols. With 10 scored, and 14 on the board overall, the humids more effectively doused the Colt 45s' batting... most memorably when

rookie catcher Faye Evans hauled in a sharp chance at the second attempt off a thin edge. Adding one more at the top of the seventh to make the score 15-12 left only a tense final stand-off to play.

THE sixshooters calmly filled the bases to get two more home, but also lost two runners to some sharp work by Drizzle shortstop Brad Hadwin, Roberts (P) and Waterhouse (1B). In the final play, a miscued hit looked to be heading towards out of bounds, but rookie third base Alun Jones followed the ball all the way, calmly taking the catch on the (imaginary) foul territory barrier, and completing a victory as sweet as balsamic-drizzled bruschetta. More jubilation ensued on the sodden side of the diamond when Drizzle realised, for the first time in a month, they would not be the last team to reach the pub.

## Blu Corner

### Infield fly if fair

This week's Blu Corner comes from Alan Green, and is a bit of a trick question.

We have an infield-fly situation, less than two outs with runners on 1st and 2nd, or 1st, 2nd and 3rd, and the ball is popped up in the infield. You correctly wait until the ball is at the top of its trajectory and then call "Infield fly if fair". Consider the following scenarios:

- (a) The ball drops in fair territory and then runs foul in front of the base.
- (b) The ball drops foul and then runs into fair territory in front of the base.

fielder going for the catch touches the ball over fair territory but drops it and it rolls foul.

(d) A fielder going for the catch touches the ball over foul territory but drops it and it rolls fair.

(e) A fielder goes for the catch and catches it in foul territory.

What is your call in each case?

### Answer

It's a bit of a trick question this week in the sense that there isn't a trick. The fact that "infield fly" has been called doesn't change anything. It's where the ball is first touched that determines fair or foul, or if it is not touched, as long as it has not passed the base, it's where the ball ends up. So in (a) and (d) it's a foul ball, so no infield fly, just a strike against the batter. In (b) and (c) the ball is fair, so it is an infield fly and the batter is out. In (e) it's not an infield fly as the ball is not fair, but the batter is nevertheless out as with a normal pop-up.
