Lions take title in imperious style Mavs II clinch Division 3 despite loss

LIONS avoided a tense title decider this week by crushing the reigning champion **Greensox** in a brutal four-inning slaughter topped off with a 20-run inning, this season's biggest single-inning score, and possibly the highest ever in the top division (box scores first appeared in the *Review* in 1998, so that would mean a lot of checking). On the other diamond, **Thunder** were doing their bit to keep the title chase alive, mercifully **Mavericks** in five innings, but all in vain. Neverthe-

less the runners-up spot which is now guaranteed means a new team has broken the big three's hegemony. The last team outside of Lions, Sox or Mavs to make the top two was the Dodgers, ten years ago in 2006.

In Division 3, **Mavericks II** suffered only their second defeat of the season against **Enforcers**, but had in any case clinched the title merely by turning up. The game turned on a 15-run 4th inning by the coppers,

and though the second steers scored steadily, the deficit was too great.

Drizzle reached seven consecutive victories in an imperious display in the first of two Z-team meetings in three weeks. The away team zoomed ahead with four consecutive batting order rotations, reaching their zenith in a 2nd inning which featured four of six total home runs, including two from Andrew Bogie and one of MVP Brad Hadwin's three in the game. The solid base hitting from the entire Drizzle order - including a particularly memorable clearance of the infield by rookie, Andreina Salazar, who batted 1.000 for the first time - was as hypnotic as a well-constructed zoetrope.

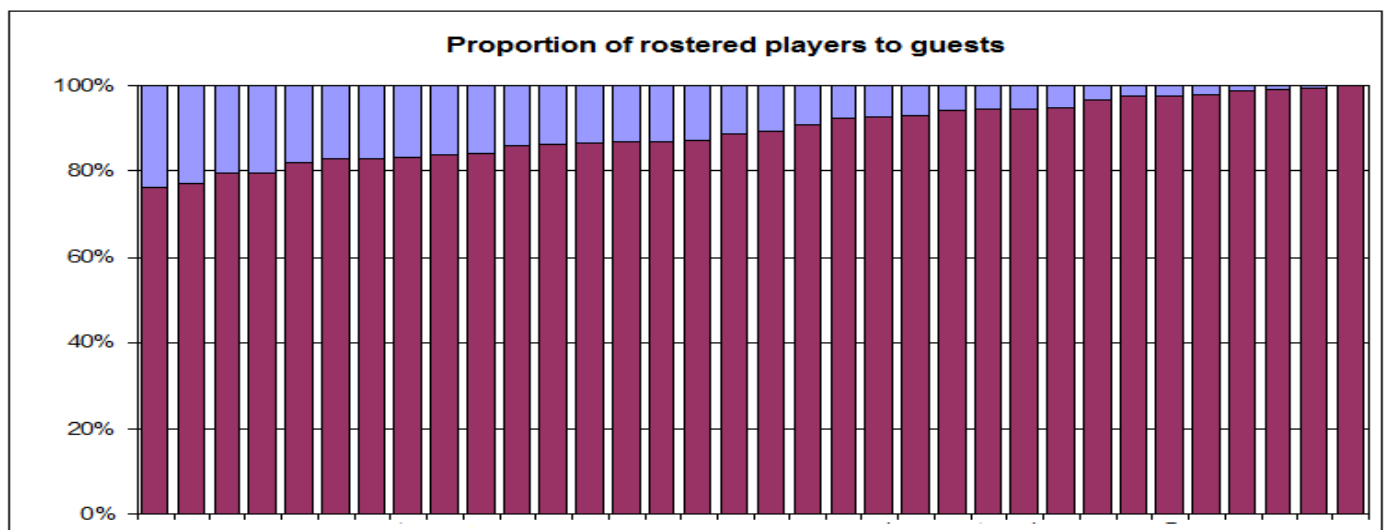

Use of guests, team by team
