Thunder rumbled by Greensox double

GREENSOX completed the double over **Thunder** with a second win in three weeks and arguably put paid to the Thorians' hopes of a title win: of course anything can happen, but with Sox now guaranteed a head-to-head lead, Thunder are effectively three wins behind the leaders. The Sox' win was comprehensive, with eight runs in both second and third innings giving them a 19-5 lead, though Thunder held off the mercy un-

til the sixth inning. No such mercy from **Lions**, who prevented half the **Dodgers** line-up from even a second plate appearance, winning 17-1 in five innings. The top two will not meet until the end of the second rotation when the Lions will hope to avenge their 7-6 loss in the first rotation. It is equally tight at the bottom, as **Lightning** beat **Meerkats** 24-17 to give them a narrow (3-run) head-to-head lead. One would expect the third meet-

ing to be a relegation decider, with only one team facing the drop this year.

IN Division 2, the **Camels** stay top with a 19-6 win over third-place **Mayhem**, completing the double for the season, and also squaring the all-time record at 2-2. **Muti-neers** remain just behind after beating **Mavs II** for the second time this year. The game was Andy Gardner's 76th consecutive appearance, surpassing Anthony

Garcia Reyes' total of 75 which remains, however, a record for consecutive appearances *for the same team*. The most exciting game last week was between the **Speeders** and the **Sharks**. A bat-around in the second gave the Speeders an 8-4 lead which they extended to 15-10 after five. Sharks reduced the lead to four, then shut out their opponents to go into the bottom of the seventh needing five to win. With two scored, but two out, the top of the order got on base, and then Paul Colton hit a walk-off 3-RBI homer to steal the win for the Scousers. Sharks remain bottom, and have been almost all season, and with no relegation this year it is mainly a question of pride, but a win this week would lift them off the bottom for the first time since the opening week.

AT the top of Division 3 Didsbury **Bats** maintained their 100% record with a 12-7 win over the **Pirates**, while the **Tigers** lost a close game to the **Outlaws** to slip 1½ games behind the leaders. The brigands got off to the better start but the felines clawed their way back into the game which was tied at 7-7 going into the final inning. The Outlaws managed a shut-out and then got two runs in on an overthrow which had (some of) the stattsos searching the rule

books to see if both runs counted (we decided they didn't). **Drizzle** hammered in 13 runs in the first inning of their game against the **Rippers** which after that was actually quite close. For the second time in a few weeks the strict interpretation of the guest rules meant that an injured player could not be substituted because to do so would render the lineup illegal. Something for the rules committee to look at in the summer perhaps.

TUESDAY evening saw comfortable wins for the **Hackers** over the **Blue Jays**, the **Rebels** who slaughtered the **Enforcers**, and **Phoenix**, who had enough players to play 6&6 but chose to make substitutions instead, as they mercied the **Meteors**. The **Colts** and **Barflies** were 9-9 after five innings, but home advantage gave the flies a win that could yet see them edge into the top half just before the split. **Titans** also furthered their chances of staying up with a 25-14 defeat of **Freeze**, while **Vipers** got their third win of the season against **Hurricanes**, despite (rather than because of) their new club policy of walking Division 1 guests. In a 19-18 win, half of the Canes' runs were scored on intentional walks of the two guests, confirming that this was a protest, not a "tactic", as head Viper Dave Warren clarified.

Simple things like umpires giving out sweets to players who have turned a great play, hit a home run or taken a great catch make all the difference and can turn a good tournament into a great experience."

Fixtures news— Div 4/5 rest week

AT their recent meeting the Exec decided that Divisions 4 and 5 would have a universal rest week on **Tuesday August 1st**. This is for several reasons. Without the rest week, the season would have ended on August 15th for the Tuesday leagues. With a rest week, all five divisions will end in the same week, August 22/23/24, with the following week available in case of a rainout. A second reason is that the weekend of August 5th-6th sees the Parrswood pitches in use for the Manchester tournament, so giving them a “rest” the week beforehand makes good sense. Finally, all the other teams will have had two or even three rest weeks, so why not the Tuesday teams too?

(Dark) Blu corner: designated hitter

ONE proposal that has been made during the very active guests debate has been to allow guest pitchers from a higher division to pitch only: their place in the batting line-up should be taken by a DH (designated hitter—in the correct meaning of this misused abbreviation, not the same as an Extra Player).

ISF rules allow for a “Designated Player” who bats instead of a “FLEX player” (who can field anywhere, not necessarily as pitcher), but only in fast-pitch. But consider this: let’s say a team starts with Fred as pitcher, but when it’s Fred’s turn to bat, up steps Jim to bat in his place. This is effectively (in our rules) a substitution. But next inning, Fred is back on the plate, pitching. In our

rules this is a legal re-entry, but Jim is now out of the game. So what would happen if Jim stepped up to bat next time it is Fred’s turn?

The rules say that Jim is an illegal re-entry: “A substitute who has legally been in the game returns to the game after being replaced by either the original starting player or another substitute”. So what should the umpire do about this? The answer is ... Nothing. This is an **appeal play**, and the opposition must appeal to the umpire that Jim is illegal. If they make no appeal, everything that happens during Jim’s plate appearance and while he is a runner is entirely legal. And this can continue throughout the game. As long as the opposition do not

object to (and appeal against) Jim batting in place of Fred, the umpire cannot do anything.

Unless, that is, they want to invoke Rule 10 Sec. 1 which says “The plate umpire shall have the authority to make decisions on any situations not specifically covered in the rules.” Just a (mad?) idea.
