## Speeders need extra innings to secure win

THERE was excitement in Division 2 as **Speeders** and **Camels II** needed an extra inning to decide a winner last week. ## Guest-rule breach—Exec ruling

IN the game between Mavericks and Lightning played June 28th, a Mavericks player was injured and substituted by a guest. This substitution rendered the batting line-up illegal according to the MSL rule that requires guests to bat as low as possible in the order.

The Exec has investigated this incident in accordance with the procedure laid out in the Captain's Handbook, section 5.5, with the Fixture Secretary acting as investigating officer in lieu of the League Secretary due to a conflict of interests. We have received statements from all parties concerned, and the Exec has reached the following conclusion:

1. That the guest was brought in to bat in an illegal position in the line-up is not disputed.
2. All those consulted have agreed that the substitution was for a genuine injury, and not an attempt to gain an advantage. Further, they all suggest that the result of the game was not materially affected by the substitution.
3. The incident very similarly mirrors one in another Division

1 game earlier this season, where the Exec imposed a 2-point suspended sentence on the infringing team.

4. For these reasons, we propose a 2-point deduction, suspended until the end of the season, the same penalty as in the previous incident.

We hope this decision is accepted as reasonable and fair.

As an additional comment, it should be noted that since the earlier incident this season referred to above (Greensox v Dodgers, June 8th), there have been occasions where due to injury, and knowing the rules because of the well-publicised earlier incident, teams have persevered with an injured player or played on with only nine players where they could have made similar substitutions to help their game situation. It is extremely helpful if captains are aware of the local rules as there have been some expressions of frustration that other teams are effectively suffering by abiding by the rules. This decision should not be interpreted as an automatic license to infringe this rule: every case will be judged on its individual merits.

RAR win in the 5th.

AT the top of Division 3, **Bats** and **Tigers** both made good starts, and it was 9-8 after just two innings. ## PW7 backstop moved

AFTER months of delays, waiting for the National Grid to confirm that the overhead powerlines are not a problem, and being let down by a number of contractors, at last the backstop on Parrswood pitch 7 has been moved to a new position at the edge of the field where the pitch

has been located for the last two years. It is hoped that some of the additional fencing at the side, and eventually the outfield fence, will also be reinstated. There are no plans at the moment to install dirt base paths or infield.

## Blu corner—hit by batted ball again

LAST week we discussed the rules concerning a runner hit by a batted ball while in contact with the base. The rules confirm that the runner is not out, but then state, rather vaguely, that “The ball will become dead or remains alive, depending on the position of the fielder closest to the base.”

We consulted Chris Moon, one of the leading umpires in this country, fresh from the European championships in Bulgaria, and he clarified the meaning of the rule.

**If the ball, having hit the runner, rebounds away from the fielder, it is dead. If however it rebounds towards the fielder, it is live.**

The idea is that the defence should not be disadvantaged by something that is not their fault, hence the dead ball call if the ball is deflected away from the field. But if the deflection is a happy one for the defence, then they are in a position to take advantage
