Respect for victims of terrorist attack ² Games preceded by a minute's silence

OLLOWING the horrendous terrorist attack on Monday evening, games 3 this week were preceded by a minute's silence. The tragedy also impacted on Tuesday night's games with the

6 Enforcers' game against the **Meteors** called off, due to large numbers of the Enforcers team who are members of GMP being called to duty. Other

teams were given dispensation to start games late as players faced transport disruption, especially those crossing the city centre. Thankfully, as far as we are aware, no one from the Manchester softball community has been directly affected by the incident, but of course we are all reeling from the shock of what has been described as "the deadliest attack on British

soil since 7/7". Mancunians were sombre and subdued the morning after, but it was quickly decided that to cancel the evening's MSL games would only be letting terrorism win.

AND so, in bright sunshine hardly fitting the mood of the evening, there were run-ahead rule wins (other names seem particularly inap-

propriate) for the **Rebels** over the suddenly faltering Blue Jays with three bat-arounds, and Hurricanes who went 15 runs ahead of Freeze in the bottom of the 5th. Titans scored 11 in the 2nd inning and were always comfortable against the Vipers, with seven runs in the 6th doubling their lead. Much closer was the game between Colt 45s and Phoenix. The Sharks had one good inning against the Mutineers, who led from the start, and managed 11 in the top of the 6th to secure a win by the run-ahead rule. Much closer was the Speeders' game with May**hem**. Fastpitch in Manchester

Where we are and where we can go next

SINCE January 2016 there have been a number of fastpitch softball sessions held in Manchester with varying degrees of success. Independently a number of under-19 players from Manchester and Sefton have signed up for the GB fastpitch programme and five of them have been selected for the squad that will play in the European championships in Prague this July, as reported in BL 23.3

Against this, numbers at some of the sessions haven't been great, there certainly aren't enough people com-

strikes on a consistent basis it's hard to play!

• A more general lack of players with previous fastpitch experience who actually want to play. There are a number of players who have played fastpitch abroad but they have slowpitch commitments and most of them aren't that keen (or don't have the time) to play fastpitch as well.

So should we just give up? I don't think so. Fastpitch softball has a lot to offer: as well as the challenge of hitting the faster pitch-

week (or weekend) indoor games through the winter there would be the chance for people to try this new version of the game and see if they like it.

The lack of pitchers is harder to solve but I think we could simplify things by initially looking to play modified pitch rather than fastpitch softball. In modified pitch the pitcher still throws the ball hard but can't leap or bring their arm round in a complete circle. This is easier to pick up for new pitchers and also has the advantage of being somewhat easier to hit (!) which



ing along to play proper regular games, and there are also other significant obstacles in the way of establishing fastpitch in Manchester:

- A lack of space in the calendar with three nights of league play each week, plus weekend tournaments and team training sessions there just isn't really much room for fast-pitch as well.
- A lack of competent pitchers without pitchers who can throw

ing, bunting and base stealing add extra layers of interest and complexity to the game that make it a new and very different challenge.

I think we should recognise that at the moment there just isn't enough time in the summer schedule to allow fastpitch to grow from scratch. But in the off season there's much more space on the calendar. If we ran midwould ease the transition from slowpitch for batters who haven't played fastpitch before.

Once we have players who have played fastpitch indoors it should be much easier to get outdoor summer fastpitch up and running. We'd have a pool of players who weren't just interested in that form of the game but also had some experience in playing it. Page 6 BASES LOADED
