Thunder slip up, Sox go top

THUNDER dropped into second place in the league following a 16-13 loss to the **Mavericks**. The steers scored steadily throughout maintaining a lead that was never really threatened. Meanwhile **Greensox** maintained their 100% record against the **Jammy Dodgers** with a comfortable 17-9 win. **Lions** were also back to winning ways with a 9-5 defeat of **Lightning**, in which the flashers were able to reduce the margin of defeat with some late runs. The top two face off this week to complete the first rotation. IN Division 2, the **Sharks** took an early lead against the **Camels**, but the runs dried up after the bactrians took the lead in the 3rd and held on to win 16-13. **Mavs II** were always in control against the **Speed-**

ers, with four shut-out innings, and won 22-15. There was an even bigger win for one-short **Mayhem** against **Camels II**, with a 12-run 4th inning doing most of the damage, and the lesser dromedaries narrowly avoiding the run-ahead rule. **SOMEONE'S** 100% record had to go in the top-of-the-table clash in Division 3, and it was emphatically the **Tigers'** as they were mercied by

Calmness was needed in the field, as the tying and winning runs were on base for the Barflies, when the batter grounded to the shortstop Dave Eaton, who took the time to throw to Emma Miller on 2nd base to record the

final out and win the game by one run.

against the Bats eight years ago almost to the day. The game also equalled the new record for the biggest margin of defeat with the run-ahead rule, the 49-6 win matching the 43-0 achieved by the Barflies, also against the Meteors, a few weeks ago. The Colts had already, earlier this season, overturned the record losing score in an RAR win from the same game in 2009.

As mentioned then (*BL* 23.3) the Outlaws-Bats game set a number of records in slightly dubious circumstances. The game is still the record highest aggregate score (88) and is responsible for several home-run records.

Note: The first recorded box scores were from opening day 1998, and included the 18-run inning shown here. For the next three years or so, full box scores were published where there was a match report, which was about half the games in those days. So there may be some missing steps up to the Hackers' 28 in July 2000, but it is unlikely. That the last two records stood for eight or nine years suggests that this may be one of the most durable records on our books.

Exec Committee announcement

The Exec is currently investigating a rule breach in a game last week, in which a guest was introduced into the line-up as a substitute for an injured player in a batting position other than "as low as possible in the batting order, subject to the rule regarding sex of batters" as stipulated in the league rules. 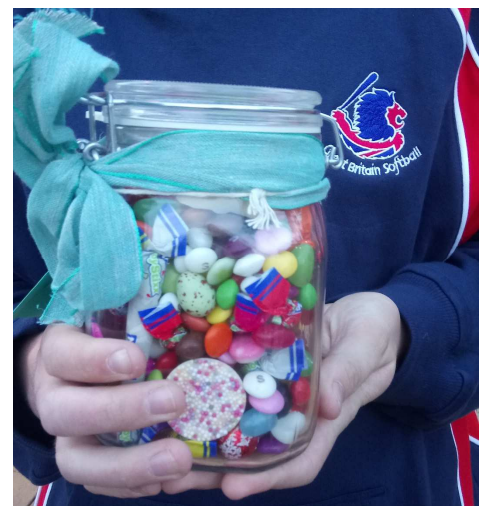

the **Bats** with only two Dan Downes homers preventing a shut-out. **Rippers** were trailing **Storm** by 14-4 when an eight-run 5th inning looked lkike bringing them back into the game, only for the tempestuous ones to match that score in the bottom of the 5th, going on to win 22-15. Meanwhile, clubmates **Drizzle** trailed the **Outlaws** from start to finish, and lost 17-9.

THERE were some close games in Division 4, and some not so close games. Closest was no doubt **Phoenix's** 21-20 defeat of **Freeze**, which went to an extra inning. Mayhem III got off to the better start, but a high-scoring 5th inning saw Phoenix take the lead for the first time. Freeze went ahead again in then 6th, but saw Phoenix get the three runs needed to tie in the bottom of the 7th, and then win the 8th 3-2. More thoughts on the guest rules

I commend Dave Warren's well thought out piece on the number of top level players playing in Division 4 matches (*BL* 23.6). I assure him this issue also occurs regularly in Division 3. I have been a long-term advocate on reducing the number and type of guests that should be allowed and was one of the movers behind reducing the maximum number of guests down to two this season.

As a matter of principle I believe that each team should have enough players to cope with the vast majority of absences every team in every sport has to cope with. This is the very essence of a team sport: most sports leagues do not allow players to play for multiple teams on a regular basis. The existing MSL rules allow teams to play one short and thus provided a stick and a carrot to recruit sufficient players for a team.

The current guest rules work in a perverse way. Not only do they remove an incentive for teams to properly recruit, they also act as an incentive to find higher division players willing to guest for them on a regular basis, thus boosting their chances to win matches. Meanwhile teams who do it properly by having an ade-

quate size of squad suffer as a result. It is simply not fair or within the spirit of having a team.

Every team faces issues in recruiting enough players but the answer is not to enable teams without enough players to keep going - in the long term it is far healthier for the league for such teams to merge with others or fold and individuals from those teams to join other teams. It's the nature of a healthy sport that teams come and go, not something that we should shirk away from.

That said, as someone who has either run a team or been part of the group within a team responsible for doing so for over 20 years, I do understand that on occasions a team will simply be caught out with a wave of one-off issues. It is for this situation that I think guest rules should be available. How could this be done? One option would be to allow each MSL team to have a maximum of six guest slots in a season along with a maximum of up to two guests a game. This would be adequate to cope with unforeseen emergencies whilst at the same time not acting as a disin-

centive for teams to properly recruit. Further I recommend that teams can only use (a) guest(s) if they have less than nine players and that they must play one short. This again means that teams can still play if they only have seven or eight players available BUT that they suffer due to only having nine players on the pitch. It's all about supporting the principle of having a sufficient squad whilst offering an appropriate stick and carrot to help out with emergency situations.
