## Sox and Bats 100% at the half-way stage

**A**S Divisions 1, 2 and 3 completed their first rotation, **Greensox** crushed **Thunder** to stay top with a 100% record. 13-3 up after two innings, the Sox were never less than ten runs ahead, and cruised home 25-9. The **Lions** and **Jammy Dodgers** had a much closer game, with the big cats taking an early lead, but the biscuits pegging them back to 9-9 after four. With defences on top, **Lions** took a one-run lead into the 7th, saw the **Dodgers** tie it up in the top of the inning, but then the home side duly made their advantage tell, winning 11-10. And in the bottom-of-the-table clash between the two so far winless teams, **Meerkats** came out on top, beating **Lightning** 13-9. While Sox remain top, there is a three-way tie for 2nd place, each of the teams having beaten one of the others. So the standings are based on runs

conceded in games between them.

A similar situation obtains in Division 3, where **Bats** completed their first rotation with a 16-6 defeat of the **Outlaws**. Meanwhile **Tigers** beat **Pirates** in a high-scoring encounter which they never looked like losing, after taking a 12-0 lead in the 2nd inning, and sit in 2nd place. In the Thunder derby, **Storm** beat **Drizzle** 21-6 in 6 innings. The Outlaws,

## Guests—the debate continues

**I**NSIDE these pages we report the Exec's decision on the guest rule breach reported last week. The committee has confirmed that the wording "as low as possible in the [batting] order" refers to the batting line-up 1-10 (or 1-12), even for substitutions, regardless of

where in the line-up has been reached at the time of the substitution. It is recognised that this creates a situation whereby only one or two players are eligible to be substituted by a guest, and this rule will certainly be looked at in the close season.

Meanwhile, the debate continues with a survey, on page 4, of guest rules around the country, and an informal poll (with admittedly loaded questions!) on the website, at <http://manchester-softball.co.uk/guesting-survey/>. Please make your views known.

## Sox and Bats 100% at half-way stage (Continued from page 1)

Pirates and Storm are locked in a three-way tie just like their Div 1 counterparts, each having beaten one of the others. Again runs conceded in the games between the three determine the order in the standings.

IN Division 2, **Mutineers** and **Camels** both have a 5-1 record after defeating **Mavericks II** and **Mayhem** respectively. Mutineers turned around a narrow deficit with a nine-run 5th inning that was the margin of victory, while the Camels' three-run win was reflected in their 6-3 3rd inning. The **Sharks'** weekly trapeze along the M62 finally bore fruit as they got their first win of the season against the **Speeders** with a late surge.

ALSO unbeaten are **Hackers** in Division 4, who found the **Hurricanes** had run out of puff. **Phoenix** are 2nd, rising from the ashes to overcome the **Rebels'** narrow early lead, swapping positions in the standings as a result. **Enforcers** swatted the **Barflies** in four innings, two of which saw 11-run salvos, while the **Blue Jays** exchanged places with the **Colts** in a convincing 12-6 win. This is the rivalry to watch, with the Division 4-5 split just four weeks away. **Vipers** slogged their way to a 28-12 RAR win over **Freeze**, while **Titans** beat **Meteors** 19-2.

## Greensox guest rule breach—Exec Committee ruling

IN last week's game between the Greensox and Dodgers, a Greensox player was injured and substituted by a guest. Since the guest was playing "up" there was no issue regarding fielding, but the guest came in to bat at #3 in the line-up. This is in contravention of MSL rules that state that guests must bat as low as possible in the order. The Exec (excluding members with a direct interest in the game) has investigated this incident in accordance with the procedure laid out in the Captain's Handbook, section 5.5, with the Secretary acting as investigating officer, since this was a question of player eligibility. When the Exec becomes aware of a possible rule breach, there is no requirement for the opposition to lodge an appeal. The investigating officer received statements from all parties concerned, including the umpire, and reached the following conclusions:

1. It is agreed that the guest

was brought in to bat in an illegal position in the line-up. No matter what the state of play and independent of where in the line-up has been reached at the time of the substitution, "the top of the order" is a unambiguous in meaning, not the same as "the next batter due up this inning", and hence so is "the bottom of the order". However this is not made sufficiently explicit in the Captain's Handbook.

2. All those consulted have agreed that the substitution was for a genuine injury, and not an attempt to gain an advantage. Further, they have all stated their belief that the result of the game was not materially affected by the substitution.

3. For these reasons, we give the Greensox a two-point deduction, suspended until the end of the season.

We hope this ruling is accepted as fair and reasonable.

## Guest rules around the country

**F**OLLOWING lively discussion in the Facebook Captains' group and elsewhere about our guest rules, we decided to find out what rules other leagues around the country have. We emailed all league heads, and received replies from Bristol, Cardiff, East Midlands (EMSL), Edinburgh, Greater London (GLMSL), Oxford, and Solent. The rules for NSL2 tournaments are also included in our survey. Additionally, we heard from the London Publishers' League which, being recreational, does not have any guest rules.

### How many guests are allowed?

Only GLMSL and Sefton allow more than two guests in any line-up (and GLMSL has other restrictions). Most allow two guests as we do, though EMSL allows only one, except for new teams who are allowed more in their first two years. Some leagues have further restrictions related to gender: Oxford allows one of each, or two females, but not two males. Solent allows only one of each gender.

### Any restrictions on who can guest?

In GLSML, with its six divisions, and also in Edinburgh, guests cannot play "down", though GLSML has a system of clubs (presumably like our

old "linked teams"), which allow a limited number of guests to do so. In Bristol, Division 1 players cannot guest in Division 3. In Solent players must be "equal to, or less able than the player or players they are replacing." They have a system whereby guests must be declared 48 hours beforehand, and the opposing captain can veto the choice.

### Do rostered players take precedence?

In Cardiff and Oxford, if ten rostered players are available, no guests are allowed. In Oxford, a guest pitcher is allowed, who must be replaced in the batting line-up by a DH (in its correct sense).

### Can you play 6&6 with guests?

Explicitly not in Bristol and also in NSL2. The Cardiff and Oxford rules which mention "ten rostered players" may imply this too, but we are not sure. In Solent the guest cannot be an EP, so that might also imply that playing 6&6 is excluded.

### Are there batting and fielding restrictions?

Yes, in every league: playing catcher or right-field and batting at the bottom of the order is almost universal. A few leagues allow the guest to pitch, and just one (Oxford) allows the guest in the infield, but then only if the gender balance rules dictate. So we are the only league that allows a guest to play 1B, though our "field any-

where" rule for guests playing "up" are shared by GLSML, for similar reasons of promoting player development.

### Are there restrictions on guest use over the season?

In GLSML and Cardiff, an individual can appear as a guest for the same team a maximum of three times. In GLSML they must then transfer to that team. In Bristol each team is allowed just five guests a season. In NSL2 you are allowed two guests per day, who must be different people. Elsewhere presumably, as in Manchester, an individual can effectively play for two teams throughout an entire season (indeed last season there were about a dozen individuals who played for the same team as a guest 10 or more times, two of them pretty much ever-present, and one of them their team's MVP).

### Anything else?

A few leagues allow some flexibility of these rules if both captains agree, but by no means all. Several leagues have quite strict rules about rostering new players within a (usually 7-day) time limit, after which new players are counted as guests or ineligible. Although not strictly a "guest" issue, difficulties with getting roster information for new players is arguably the current secretary's biggest headache, so any rules that focussed captains' attention on getting a new player's address and date of birth before they leave the pitch would be most welcome.

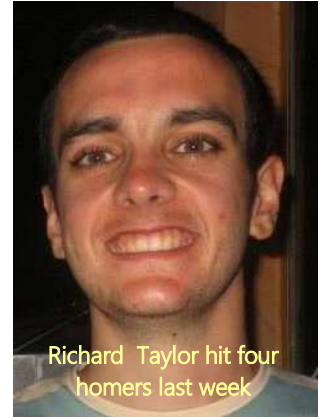
