## On this day ...

May 3rd 2000 saw the first softball of the new millennium and a 9-6 win for the HACKERS against the BATS in only their eighth meeting (they have now played each other 39 times in the most-played fixture between founder members). Elsewhere, DODG-ERS started their season with a 20-20 tie against the Panthers.

The force was evidently with the SPEEDERS on May 4th 2005 when they beat the HACKERS 27-11, though fortunes were reversed when the same pair met 364 days later, Hackers winning 21-12.

Back in 2016, Divisions 3 and 4 kicked off a week before the top two, so May 4th was opening day in Divs 1 and 2. That week saw an interesting double header as MAV-ERICKS beat CAMELS 28-4, while their respective II teams met the previous evening, Mavs also prevailing.

THUNDERbies used to feature Thunder and Lightning, and this date in history has seen two of them: in 2012 Thunder won their first ever Division 1 meeting with a 24-3 "mercy" win, but their opening-day meeting in 2017 was a much tighter affair, as Bases Loaded reported: "The boomers edged ahead until the 5th when the flashers scored eight to take a 16-14 lead. Order was restored in the final two innings with the senior partners prevailing by 18-16."

them out then scored nine to give them a lead which they successfully defended for the remaining 21/2 innings. The evening's other game saw the **Barflies**, unmissable in their new kit, and the **Raiders** slugging it out in the week's highestscoring game. The flies established a decent lead in the first inning after which the two teams scored evenly ... until the top of the 6th when the Barflies quadrupled their lead, scoring 12. Raiders replied with half that many runs, and bad light brought the game to an end with the score 32-22.

Wednesday's weather was similar, the conditions likewise apparently favouring offense: Bats and Freeze didn't quite match the previous night's 55-run aggregate, but came close: in a game which allowed the two promoted teams to gauge how different Division 2 would be, first Bats then Freeze took the lead, but after six innings it was tied at 18-18. The away team seized the opportunity, scoring 11 to Freeze's 4 to take the win. Camels @ Thunder opened the season in both divisions: in Div 2, it was

a game of two halves as Thunder II took the initiative but Camels II fought back to win 20-14, while in Division 1 Thunder's seniors were never behind against the Camels, and a 15-run 4th inning sealed the win. In the evening's closest game, the first ever meeting of the **Dodgers** and **Titans**, it was 7-7 after two, but the evaders inched into the lead, particularly with a 7-run bat-around in the 6th. Titans replied with eight, just one short of the total required to make Dodgers bat again. The Travelling Dodgers' defense of their title looked to have got off to a good start, with 11 runs in the opening inning. But **Mayhem** had other ideas and batted steadily to lead 21-16 when the game was called for bad light. Sharks led the Mavericks for a short while but then the runs dried up in this untypically lowscoring affair, as Mavs won 12-7. Mavericks II fared less well against the Tigers, who led from start to finish, and look a good tip for promotion. Speeders and Meerkats were granted a postponement, with the former unable to raise a team, and joined the Greensox and Hackers on a well-earned "rest".

## League structure: Correction

In last week's issue, we stated that promotion and relegation would be two-up two-down "throughout all four divisions" which would leave Division 3 and 4 "evenly split...". This is evidently not the case with currently seven and five teams in the two divisions as it stands.

We are hoping that a new team will form during this season, giving us a 7&6 split. But even if not, the statement that promotion/relegation will be two-up two-down remains true, and if we have a 7&5 split again next year, the same regime as this year will apply.

The other divisions are unaffected.

## Softball records

s the season starts, players might have their eyes on some of the MSL's records, some attainable, some less so.

In the second category are the league's biggest winning margin of 59, achieved by the Mavericks on two occasions way back in 1998 and 2001, against the Bats and Runners respectively. With the run-ahead rule, introduced in 2002, that record is unlikely to be broken ... though in 2017 the Meteors lost twice by 43 runs - the record for an RAR defeat - once to Barflies, and once to Colt 45s. The closest anyone got to that last season was the Stingers' 29-run margin in their 33-4 defeat of the Enforcers.

That Mavs win in '98 also saw the highest individual score of 65, though that was matched in 2009 by the **Outlaws** in a game against the Bats in which several new records were set, including the all-time highest aggregate score of 88. Last year's high was the Stingers' 33 runs (37 aggregate) already mentioned.

The Outlaws also featured in the lowest aggregate score when they beat Greensox 2-0 in 2013. Last year's lowest aggregate was 8, which occurred twice, and the lowest winning score was 6, which happened three times (two of which between the same teams, Meerkats and Speeders).

For the narrowest ever win we go all the way back to 1996, just the second year of full records, when **Greensox** beat **Pirates** 35-34, though a year earlier the **Bats** and **M16s** set the oldest record still intact with the highest scoring tie, 37-37. Barflies 26 Screwballs 25 was the tightest game last year, and there was just one tie, 14-14 between Tigers and Mavs II.

An extra inning is not so rare, though more than one is: the record is four, when Mavericks beat Dodgers 15-14 in 11 innings in July 2017. Three games last year went to extra innings, but all three were resolved in the 8th.

In June 2017, **Colt 45s** scored 36 runs in a single inning against the Mete-

ors, the record highest score in an inning. Last year Stingers got 27 in their 2nd inning against the Enforcers, in the game already mentioned.

We typically have two or three shutouts a year, though the first was not recorded until 1998. The biggest shut out was achieved by the **Speeders** in that year, when they beat the Legal Eagles 53-0. Just one shutout last year: Meerkats v Titans.

There are some homerun records which we will perhaps cover at a future date, but let's end on some active streaks. With 39 consecutive appearances, Emma Miller (Thunder II) is the current leader, but has a long way to reach Brad Hadwin's 7-season record of 92 games. With 6 consecutive wins, Thunder and Meerkats lead the race for the Mavericks' all-time record of 32 which included a perfect season. Bandidos broke their 13-game losing streak last week, some way from matching the sorry Dragons' record of 20 games without a win.
