Some close games, some not so close

Wednesday evening saw a delayed season start for four teams, all of whom got off to a losing start. The closest of these to a win were the **Greensox**. who were leading Thunder 9-4 after four innings. But then the rumblers rallied, batted round the order to score eight in the 5th and defended the lead to win 13 -12. **Speeders**' return to the top flight after 13 years ended in a 20-5 run -ahead rule loss to Mavericks, whom they have only beaten once in now 17 meetings. The return of the **Meerkats**, after a somewhat shorter absence, was also not fruitful, although they at least held the lead briefly, until Travelling Dodgers got going, scoring six in the 3rd and winning 10-5. Consolation perhaps in that their winter recruit Carlos dos Ramos hit a homer for the seventh consecutive game. Camels scored steadily to beat Mayhem 16-9, leaving both teams, as well as TDs, tied on a 1-1 record. It's early days yet of course, but head-toheads and runs conceded give exactly opposing 1-2 -3 ordering in the standings for these three.

On this day ...

10th May 1995 was the opening day of the first season for which we have full records, so you could call it "Day 1" of our league. Platt Fields Pirates beat Rusholme Funsters 54-11, Ringway Runners beat Just Lust (predecessors of today's Dodgers) 52-9, but perhaps the most interesting scoreline was the Greensox and Mavericks who tied 14-14 in their first officially recorded meeting. In League 2 as it was known, Didsbury Bats beat TSBees 30-14, Fog Lane Foghorns beat M16s 22-19, while the Hackers' game was postponed. Their opponents should have been a team controversially called Mad Twatters (they argued that their name was

based on the local slang word meaning "to hit something hard"), a relatively short-lived team who folded the following season.

The big news in the *Review* of 9th May 2001, was that we were "saying farewell" to the University Sports grounds at Wythenshawe, where we had played all our games since 1995, having "outgrown" their facilities (though the bar being shut down because of asbestos was no doubt also a factor). A "new venue" at Parrs Wood School had been found.

It is a measure of the passage of time that of all the fixtures played on May 9th or 10th in 2011 and 2012, only one Division 1 match-up will be repeated this year: on this date in 2012, Greensox beat Thunder 18-3. However, Tuesday 10th

May 2012 saw Meerkats beat Mayhem 14-13 ... in Division 3!

10th May 2017 was notable in that two Division 2 games both ended with 27-26 wins: winning by the odd run in 53 were Camels II against Mavs II, and Mayhem against Sharks, though these were some 16 runs short of the closest game in history, in which Greensox beat Pirates 36-35 on 1st May 1996.

Bringing us round full circle from the first item, 9th May 2018 saw Mavericks win their 6oth meeting with Greensox, the most played fixture in MSL history. Mayhem beat Bats in a game that kicked off with the pair sharing 27 runs between them in the first inning. Mavs II beat Sharks 32-17 while Meerkats narrowly beat Speeders 12-11.

In Division 2 Freeze managed three runs in their opening inning but then came up against a Mavericks II team in mighty form, scoring 7, 17 and 13 in multiple batarounds. Thunder II led off with ten runs, and although Bats replied with six, the boomers prevailed to win 19-15. Camels II had three 8run bat-arounds before easing off against the Titans, playing one short, whose 11 runs were not enough to avoid a "mercy" loss. Finally, the **Dodgers** led from start to finish in their long awaited (since 1996) reunion with **Hackers**, a final 11-run inning rubbing salt into the wound.

Five of the six games on Tuesday were interdivisional, and although there were two "slaughters", the other three games went the distance. Enforcers looked like causing an upset against Screwballs, leading 13-5 after four innings. But the cocktailers got it back to 13-11 in the 5th and, after a scoreless 6th, hit ten in the top of the 7th to take a 21-14 lead which the coppers could barely dent. More comfortable were the

Seagulls against Thunder IV, featuring the league's third-youngest ever debutant as mentioned last week. The gulls led from start to finish and won 15-8. Tiggers never looked in danger against the Raiders, building on a 7-0 lead after three, and ending the game with a flurry of runs to win 23-11. The two run-ahead rule wins saw **Bandidos** lead off with a double bat-around against the Barflies. and were 25-0 up after just 21/2 innings, but the flies scored six in the bottom of the 3rd before succumbing 29-7 after four. Thunder III were 11-1 up against the **Swingers** after two, and doubled their tally in the 3rd, winning 27-6 after four.



Yet another GB call-up

There was another GB call-up for a Manchesterbased player as Freeze's **Amber Frost** (pictured) was selected for the Under-15 Women's Fastpitch team to compete at Under-17 level in the 2023 Canada Cup, one of the world's most prestigious open women's fastpitch tournaments, to be held in mid-July in Surrey, British Columbia, near Vancouver.

Head coach Jodie Rushin explains on the British Softball Federation website that while Under-17 is not an ordinary GB age group, the team will be

composed primarily of Under-15s supplemented by some older players. The team will play against opponents from the USA, Canada and Israel.

Manchester players being selected for GB teams is a great reflection on our league and of course a great honour and reward for hard work. Well done, Amber! You'll do us proud.



Home run records

ast week the Bandidos' Ross Birch hit four home runs in four at bats. This was two short of the record set by Andy Rawson for the Outlaws in a remarkable game against the Bats in June 2009, when a number of records were set. Subsequently one of the captains in that game admitted that the game had been somewhat artificially prolonged so as to smash a few records. But coming back to last Tuesday, of course one obstacle to breaking Rawson's record is the fact that if a game is one sided, a player does not get enough plate appearances: by the time Birch had batted four times, his team were 20 runs ahead. It's a huge target but may be achievable: last year Joe Regan of the Swingers hit five against the Tiggers.

One might imagine that the 16.000 slugging average reflected a disparity between the two teams, and perhaps some of his hits might have gone to glove in Division 1 or 2. But Birch hit a further two runs the following evening, as a guest for

Division 2's Titans. So who is to say?

Another home run record that is still being pursued is the one for homering in consecutive games.

Carlos dos Ramos continued his run (currently seven games) with a round trip for his new team, Meerkats, last week, and is half way to catching Bandido Liam Morrison, who homered

in 14 consecutive games back in 2019.

And talking of sequences, congrats to Pablo Kidlev (Greensox) and Ian Mills (Hackers) who, along with Ross Birch, have already kept up their run of hitting a home run every year (excluding 2020) since records began in 2003. Pete Nightingale can join that list if and when
