gale (pictured), whose home run makes him the fourth batter to have hit a homer every year since records began (as reported last week). Meanwhile

Sharks had it pretty much all their own way against the **Speeders** from start to premature finish, the game being called for bad light after five innings with the seadogs 12 ahead.

In Division 2, **Camels II** maintained their 1.000 record with a 19-12 defeat of the **Hackers**, who might have been described as resplendent in their new uniforms, had they not been mostly hidden beneath rainwear. The pair shared ten runs in the 1st inning, but then the bactrians edged ahead, a lead extended to ten runs with a bataround 5th inning. Hats

off to camel Conor Battersby for owning up to having been tagged on a crazy home run attempt where three runners came in an inch apart with Ian Mills able to tag two of them. **Bats** led **Titans** for four innings but let it all slip, conceding six and seven runs in the 5th and 6th innings, losing 20-14. The other two

games were much less tight: Mavericks II scored steadily and defended stoutly to beat Thunder II 15-3, while Freeze continued to find Division 2 tough

work, conceding 11 and then seven to **Tigers** on the way to a four-inning "mercy" loss.

Tuesday's weather had been much more clement. In a spectacular comeback, Sluggababes and Barflies shared 57 runs in an amazing game where the flies took an early lead which the babes equalised in the 3rd. With the teams tied 12-12 after four, the sluggers did what it says on the can and more than doubled their tally with a 13-run onslaught. Barflies could only manage one run in response, and narrowly avoided the "slaughter" as the slugs

scored two of the three needed in the top of the 6th. Cue the Barflies' recovery as they scored 17 in a triple bat-around then shut out the babes to win 30-27. There was another thrilling climax in Division 3 as **Bandidos** came from behind to beat Thunder III 19-15. Having trailed from the 2nd inning onwards, the win was secured with two shut-outs and a five-run rally. In the other all-Div 3 encounter, Screwballs were 16-1 up before Stingers rallied somewhat, scoring six, but the cocktailers simply responded with more of the same, and in the bottom of the 6th scored the one run needed to complete a 25-10 RAR win. There was a "mercy" win too for Seagulls against the Swingers, who shared 47 runs, with the partiers even managing a bataround seven-run 2nd inning. And Enforcers completed a run-ahead rule against Raiders with nine runs in the 1st and eight in the 4th. Thunder IV took a 13-9 lead over Tiggers after 31/2 innings, but the bouncers tied it up by the bottom of the 5th, and a seven-run bat-around in the 6th was enough to give them a 20-15 win.

Softball vocabulary

In last week's report "Home run records" a reference was made to a slugging average of 16.000. In fact, four home runs in four at bats would give a slugging average of 4.000.

For those who are unaware of this statistic, it is calculated by dividing the total number of bases reached on each hit by the number of at bats: so 4.000 is the maximum possible value.
