## Serious injury halts game

his week's roundup is dominated by the serious injury sustained by Travelling Dodgers' pitcher Annie Downes (see second story, below) in their game against Greensox, which was abandoned in the 5th inning, to be resumed when the teams meet in the second rotation, conditions permitting. Elsewhere, leaders Mavericks completed the first rotation unbeaten, though Meerkats ran them close, scoring 12 in the 1st inning, and leading 19-9 after three. But it was a game of two halves as the Mays reduced the deficit to just one run, then got both their offence and defence going to take the win 26-24. The Shearers returned from holiday to lead Sharks to only their second win of the campaign, against Mavhem, who never really got going: final score 13-5. And after the previous week's win, **Speeders** were back in the runners-up berth after a five-inning "mercy" by **Thunder** in their first meeting for 13 years.

# On this day ...

21st June 2000 saw Manchester host the Major League Baseball Softball Tournament. This was a regular event in those days, normally held in London of course (no Farnham Park in those days), sponsored by the

MLB. It involved nearly 60 teams from all over the UK and Ireland, each kitted out (and renamed) with MLB team uniforms. A highlight was the all-Manchester final in the Comp II competition between the then big rivals, Mavericks and Renegades, rebranded as Yankees and Expos respectively, which is why they are wearing similar uniforms in this classic picture sequence (by Dave Wareham) showing Pete Nightingale evading Lisa Mayhew's tag to score.

5's weekly baseball programme, presented by Jonny Gould, who came up for the tournament and can be seen showing off his MSL T-shirt in this picture, alongside co-presenter Tod 'The Moose' Macklin.

It was the first time Manchester had been 'trusted' to host a national event, and paved the way for future events up here. As Lisa Mayhew's report in the *Review* said, "the great big red gleaming cherry on the cake was no long drive home after it was over."

TDs captain Jonny Huck noted that players were naturally hugely upset by the incident, as was the player involved, who need not be named—nor blamed. But Huck added "On a practical point it may be a good time to remind players that when there is a play at home the runner should be sliding in. I see players with grazes across their calf or shins that look sore from sliding but the alternative is something like last night where there was a mismatch in

size, with the player running at full speed and a more significant injury was sustained. There was no malice in the incident but it wasn't pleasant viewing, nor was the aftermath of lots of blood, and a player seemingly losing consciousness momentarily whilst on the ground."

Renewing the rivalry of mid-season rookie development teams, the pink and blue wrecking crew needed just four innings to remain unbeaten against Manchester Raiders, sealing a 27-7 early run-ahead rule triumph in interdivisional play at Parrs Wood. Their winning streak intact, Screwballs (8-0) head into their showdown with Bandidos (7-1) atop MSL Division 3. Screwballs have never lost to Raiders since their expansion start in 2021, pushing the overall mark to four wins in four tries.

As members of separate divisions, it will be the only regular season meeting between the two clubs.

The Raiders (1-7) started

the game hot, putting up four runs in the opening frame. They could have had more: Richard Valentine snuck a long drive into the gap for a sure RBI triple, but got greedy and tried to make it a four-bagger. A slick relay from Isaac Howard to Hannah Tillyard to Dan Strayer to Caz Millan cut him down at home for a big first out.

Two outs later, the wrecking crew batted around in a dizzying bottom half of the 1st inning. An eighth home run for AJ Hoysted (pictured), plus a sparkling debut from newcomer Kat Craine, pushed Screwballs into an 8-4 advantage. They would not relinquish the lead.

Alternating the pitching between starter Naveed Ahmed and Strayer, Screwballs would only allow a single run in each of the next three innings. Guest Stéphane Karayannis blasted a pair of solo homers off Strayer, but that was all the damage the navy and red could manage.

Hoysted stayed hot, blasting his team-leading eighth longball of the season to lead off the bottom of a two-run 2nd inning. Strayer followed suit with his seventh of the year to highlight a three-run 3rd, pushing the lead to 13-6.

Though the Raiders mustered another tally to cut the deficit to six runs, the rout was on in the last half of the 4th. Awaiting



their "usual 14-run inning" (as has become customary in recent weeks), the pink and blue wrecking crew indeed registered the equivalent of two touchdowns and extra points to seal the victory.

Screwballs totalled 14 hits in the frame with big tallies from catcher Millan and small-ball MVP and outfielder Carola Guevara. They then closed out the 4th-inning run-ahead rule victory on the back of large-ball MVP Zak Morris. Morris, an original Screwball, promptly drilled a grand slam, which proved to be the walk-off hit that kept Screwballs atop the Division 3 standings for the second week in a row.

Morris tallied seven RBIs on the strength of a fourhit day, scoring four runs. Hoysted also recorded four base knocks, scoring three runs of his own. Straver drove in five, while Ahmed posted three hits and drove in four. Co-captains Tillyard and Millan, as well as former Raiders Milan Nechvátal and Rachel Loggenberg, and sophomore stud Emma Swarsbrick, had three hits apiece.

An offensive picture of balance despite having just four innings to score, six individual Screwballs tallied at least three runs.

NEXT WEEK: Screwballs will have to work very hard to put up another 14-run inning Tuesday night. It's showdown week for midseason bragging rights to Division 3, as they welcome Bandidos at Parrs Wood. Though technically in third place, Bandidos

hold the fewest runs conceded in the division, undercutting the Screwballs by 54. A pink and blue loss could engender a three way tie at the top of the table, provided second-place Stingers (7-1) outlast host Raiders on Pitch 4 Tuesday night. Whatever the result, a competitive, down-to-the -wire second half awaits in Division 3.

anchester's NSL teams headed south for the second edition of National Softball League play for 2023 last weekend, and when it was over, Meerkats were sitting top of NSL3—though only by a half game—while the others were less well placed, to say the least.

Promotion is the first order of business for the NSL3 teams that aspire to it, and Meerkats will go into the final NSL weekend in July facing fierce competition from Bracknell and Storm. Meerkats went 5-2 for the weekend, their overall record now 12-3, top of NSL3 by dint of having played one more game than Bracknell.

NSL weekends end with a one-off knock-out competition based on that weekend's games, and Meerkats, having lost in the final in May, went one better this time, beating Storm by 13-10 in the semi-final, then running up a huge score to win the Cup final over Bracknell by 34-9.

MSL's other NSL3 representatives are faring less well. Tempest 2 went 3½ -3½, exactly mirroring their May figures, and

# Exec statement

In a game a few weeks ago a team, after hitting a lot of runs, asked the umpire if they could "declare" and forgo the rest of that inning. After some discussion, including with one of the players who is also an umpire, this was mistakenly allowed. In fact, at no point during a game is it allowed to forgo an inning and according to the rules, this would be seen as a refusal to play and result in the game being forfeited.

Why did this happen? Two weeks earlier they had been playing in a tournament with timed games in which the away team was allowed to "declare" in the last inning to avoid the scores "rolling back". We have no doubt that this was done with the best of friendly intentions, to give everyone more game time and to help the opposing team develop, and we praise that good intent. Both teams and the umpire in charge of the fixture have been informed about the correct rules. There is no call on this occasion for any punitive action against the team, or for the result to be altered; we appreciate and applaud a team willing to help their opponents. But they must be aware of the appropriate way to do this. The Exec

Meanwhile, let's address the question of whether softball players in Manchester have got


older over the years? In fact as the table above shows, the average age of all players had been fairly steady (even though returning players are a year older each season), until the COVID-affected 2020 season (for which

we do not have players' age data) but even then the rise is only by about a year—and this year's average may still go down as we could expect a few


more players to register before the end of the season.
