In the extra inning, home advantage saw the steers home 4-3 with a walk-off grand slam by Danny Gunn. Mayhem also lost narrowly to **Travelling Dodgers.**

On this day ...

July 4th 2001 was the 15th meeting of Greensox and Mavericks and saw Mavs win 20-19 in 8 innings, which remains the closest result in their now 73-game history.

The pair met again 11 years later, Sox winning 12-2, but the previous day had been more momentous for MSL, with the first ever Division 4 games taking place:
Aarmavarx (who went on to become the first winners of the trophy) beat Moorkats 25-8, Drizzle beat Barflies 9

-4 and Camels II beat Phoenix 9-2.

By 2017 Division 4 had expanded to 12 teams, with a 5th division around the corner. On July 5th Mavericks and Dodgers found themselves in what was and remains the longest game in MSL history, requiring 11 innings before Mavs could register a 15-14 win.

Club Thunder completed a double over Club Camels as Thunder II beat Camels II by an almost identical 17-8 scoreline, in a game that was close until a six-run 4th took the game away from the humped ones, who however remain in the promotion slot, now two games behind the **Dodg**ers, who continued their perfect season with a 21-11 defeat of the **Titans**. The giants were leading for half the game, but the avoiders took hold of the game with six runs in the 4th. There was a close and high-scoring game between Mavericks II and **Tigers**: the felines took a 4-0 lead in the 1st, to which the Mavs responded with seven, but Tigers went again, regaining and steadily increasing their lead and were 22-13 up after five innings. Mavs got to within two runs in the 6th but the big cats held out and won without needing their final half-inning. There were husband-andwife home runs for Laurie and Kelby Salfred-Ingham, but no win for **Freeze** against the **Bats** who have taken up a comfortable mid-table position.

Tuesday saw a return to winning ways for Bandidos, though Seagulls gave them a close game from start to finish, taking an early lead, trailing in the middle innings, but recovering to come within three runs in the final inning, losing 33-30. Two players managed four home runs each in this game, where several bataround innings saw batters making six or seven plate appearances. In the other three games played,

the run-ahead rule was invoked, though Raiders did score a respectable 19 runs in reply to **Thunder** III's 35. Clubmates Thunder IV led off with seven, then failed to score against the **Stingers**, in a game which saw five of the six home runs hit with a small ball, including a grand slam from Amy Sykes. Two years ago Screwballs and Sluggababes were both promoted from Division 4 and last met on the final day of 2022. The cocktailers continued their perfect season, and 100% record against the slugs with a "mercy" win in 41/2 innings. Swingers were unfortunately unable to raise a team, which gave **Barflies** a night off and a 20-0 win, while Tiggers' game against the newly named Fireballs will be played on July 25th, which coincidentally would have been a rest week for both teams.

old wrecking crew turned the tables in a five-inning 28-10 laugher at Field 2 on the Parrs Wood School Complex.

AJ Hoysted took home big-ball MVP honours for the night, keeping pace atop the team home run leadership board with yet another round tripper. Trailing 1-0 in the bottom of the 1st, he also came around the first of 17 runs in the inning. In all, the 10-0 Screwballs tallied 31 hits in just four innings of hitting.

Hoysted would finish the game with three runs scored, complete with a walk, a double and a homer. The longball constitutes his ninth of the 2023 season. Teammate Dan Strayer had a solo homer to lead off the 4th, also bringing his tally to nine. With four RBIs, Strayer now has a

team-best 39, and he also hit for the cycle—the third time he's done so this year.

Naveed Ahmed added his own round-tripper, his third of the season. Adding a pair of doubles and a single, his four-hit day produced four RBIs. Triples were recorded by Hannah Tilyard, Strayer, Zak Morris, Milan Nechvátal, and Isaac Howard. In all, 14 of the Screwballs' 31 hits netted extra bases.

The Sluggababes would get no closer again than 17-6, as the rout was on. But they did have a moment to remember as bigball MVP Alex Wardle drilled a grand slam in the 2nd inning to bring the affair much closer.

Screwballs would subsequently add two, six and three between the 2nd and 4th frames to put the contest into the runahead rule zone.

Ahmed pitched a sterling affair for the Pink and Blue. The southpaw picked up his sixth win in 2023, lasting 3½ innings before giving way to Dan Strayer, who shut out the Maroon and Black the rest of the way.

In all, Hoysted, Ahmed, Strayer, Nechvátal (two doubles, two singles) and Caz Millan drove in four runs apiece. Captain Millan closed out a great month of June: she tallied 13 hits, reached twice by way of a walk, and drove in 12 runs. Furthermore, she spearheads a team that remains unbeaten through 10 league games.

With Stingers at 9-1 and Bandidos close back at 8-2, it's conceivable that every win will be absolutely necessary in the season's final two months.

LOOKING AHEAD TO WEEK 11: Sluggababes (6-4) hope to get back on track with an interdivisional showdown with Manchester Raiders on Pitch D at WSG to commemorate 4th of July celebrations. The Screwballs also undertake their last interdivisional contest of 2023 against host Swingers on Pitch E.

Using guests fairly

Greetings MSL Softballers.

Over the last few weeks it has come to the attention of the Exec that the "guest rules" are not being used in a fair and appropriate manner. The guest rules are there to allow teams to field a full team to play a game. Teams should not be using guests to enhance their teams and teams should be using their own players when available to pitch, play at 1st base and short stop. These are all pivotal spots in a team and can enhance a team's performance when a guest is brought in.

The original positions allowed for guest when the guest rules came in were catcher, right field and 1st base. But it was realised that 1st base is a pivotal defensive position and this was removed from the guest playing position as teams were bringing in specialist guests. The pitcher position was allowed for guests when the league were regularly getting new teams entering which perhaps had only one player who could pitch, and when they were not available the team would struggle and the game would suffer. Pitching is not easy and

is a specialist position but in the essence of fair play and sportspersonnship, your own rostered players should be used first in that position before a guest is used. Yes they may not be pitching well, but that's what sport is all about. It's about encouraging your team mates to play well even if they are struggling.

So with this in mind we encourage teams to play fairly and with good sportspersonship when it comes to using guests.

GB call-up for Laura

Thunder's Laura Hirai was named as one of the three reserves for the Great Britain fastpitch team which will compete at the 2023 Softball World Cup Pool A in Balbriggan, Co. Dublin, next month. According to the BSF website, roster selection took place following a four-day trial camp held in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Selection was "in accordance with the British Softball Federation's World Cup selection policy", which

Laura, who is originally from London, was at Swarthmore College in Pennsylvania 2018-22, and is one of only a few homegrown players to play college softball in the United States.

GB will face the toprated USA team along with Chinese Taipei, Australia, host nation Ireland and Botswana. They qualified for the Softball World Cup by virtue of their second-place finish at the 2022 European Women's Championship.

A training and preparation camp

will be held in the UK starting this week, including the "Royal Spark Challenge", a two-game exhibition series at Farnham Park July 6th and 7th (first pitch 6.30pm) that

will see Great Britain welcome the Oklahoma City Spark to Farnham Park, the first time ever a professional softball team will play in the UK. The Spark are part of Women's Professional Fastpitch (WPF) in the United States and feature some of the best players in professional softball. Both games will be free and open to the public, and the Home Plate Bar + Kitchen at Farnham Park will be open for refreshments during and after the games.

Laura, who moved to Manchester only last September, is also in-



volved in BSF's Athletes Commission, which has been created to help the BSF Executive better understand the needs and views of the different constituencies within British softball. Laura is the BSF's Fastpitch Development Officer, and works with BaseballSoftballUK on the design and delivery of development initiatives that can get more people, especially young people, playing the format, and also look at ways to improve and extend existing fastpitch competition structures, particularly the Great Britain Fastpitch League.
