Camels are champions; Stingers win back-to-back titles

Congratulations to **Spittin' Camels** our new champions (as long as they don't forfeit), a ninth new name on the trophy. Although **Thunder** completed their season with a 21-12 defeat of **Meerkats**, to equal Camels' current points tally, having beaten the **Dodgers** 31-19, Camels hold the head-to-head advantage over Thunder, so even if they lose their last game, against Mavs, the title is theirs. Thunder's Joe Grantham had a soft warning from the umpire which he took on board but unfortunately went on to make a terrible play in the last inning of the game, an easy ground ball to the pitcher which he couldn't field and which he kicked all the way to 1st base, but the runner was still safe. It didn't affect the result however. **Mayhem's** defeat of the **Mavericks** means they could snatch

3rd place, as Mavs face the Camels in their final game, while the Mossley crew have two games to play. **Titans** beat **Sharks**, but are all but mathematically down: because they forfeited their first game against Meerkats, who they play this week, both Meerkats and Dodgers, whose points total they could also match, need only turn up to secure their places for next year, even if they lose.

Congratulations also to **Stingers** who likewise need only to turn up in order to secure the Division 2 title. Their 26-13 defeat of the **Bats** means that even if they lose, **Screwballs**, who completed their programme with a 23-17 defeat of the **Tigers**, would have the same win-loss record but lost both their head-to-heads to the Stingers. The win completes back-to-back promotion, which we have not seen since Mets man-

aged three consecutive titles: Divisions 3, then 2 then via the Playoff Division into Division 1 between 2008 and 2011. While Screwballs currently sit in the second promotion slot, Camels II, on their rest week last Wednesday, will overtake them if they beat the Bats this week: both would have 11-5 records, and in head-to-heads they have one win each. By the narrowest margin, Camels would take 2nd place with an 18-17 aggregate! In the other games, **Speeders** beat **Thunder III** 26-15,

while **Mavericks II** beat **Hackers** 15-9, despite playing much of the game one-short: an injury to stalwart Chris Gresty meant that they had to finish the game with nine players and an auto out. A local league rule allows teams to play one short: under full softball rules, with no sub to replace the injured player, Mavs would have forfeited the game.

In Division 3, **Barflies** secured the second promotion slot with a narrow victory over **Fireballs** in the most-played fixture in this division. The Flies took an early lead, but saw Fireballs even it up at 11-11 in the 4th with a seven-run bat-around. The Phoenix then edged into the lead, leaving the home side to score three in the bottom of the 7th to gain the win. **Bandidos** and **Freeze** had a fairly close game until Freeze let loose with 11 runs in the bottom of the 4th as the light faded. The Mexicans narrowed the deficit to four, but the umpire

correctly called it a day as the street lights pierced the gloom. **Tiggers** and **Liver Birds** were even stevens for four innings, but the felines bounced back to outscore the avians 11-3 in the last two innings to take the win. It was a game of two halves between **Raiders** and **Toras**, the latter leading for the first four innings. But the Raiders came back in the final innings. Luke Cranage had an incredible bare-handed catch at short stop before fumbling a rolling ball to win the game on the next play. "From the sublime to the ridiculous". The newbie **OddSox** faced the champions, with the expected result as Sluggababes won 21-1 in four innings. Mavericks II continued a late-season resurgence following their second consecutive win against the Hackers but at the cost of a calf injury to the talismanic Chris Gresty that is likely to rule him out for the season finale next week.

At a gloomy and subdued WSG, with both teams missing players, the game matched the weather with a lethargic start from both teams cancelling each other out.

The Mavs broke out in the 3rd inning, led off by Gresty with a single. However as the next batter followed up with a hit, the Mavs' shortstop pulled up

in immediate discomfort and managed to hop himself to 2nd before being pulled from the game with a suspected calf tear. Gresty's teammates, now down to nine players, managed to rally for seven runs to take commanding 9-4 lead that they did not relinquish, with both sides trading a handful of runs for the remainder of the game.

The already relegated Hackers could take some solace from a spectacular diving outfield catch from Jack Hoban that saved two runs, and also the honesty of their other MVP, Evie Saunders, who as well as being the top SBH also walked when a close groundout at 1st went her way, which was particularly welcome in a player-umpired game. Mavs' LBH MVP was Mike Goff for consistent hitting (4 for 4) and excellent outfield play. For the SBH it was Jane Curley (3 for 4). Other notables were Ian Williams (4 for 4), David Martin Baez (4 for 4, HR, 5 RBIs) and Charleen Chris-

tofi (3 RBIs). A special mention to Luca Mulholland who recorded her first ever Mavs hit. The lowest the Mavs can finish is 6th although a win in their final game against the Speeders could move them up a place and would leave them with a winning 9-7 win-loss record for the season.

A bridge too far?

Is the gap between the 1st and 2nd divisions too large?

Chatting with my carpark neighbour after a recent softball game brought back a lot of memories of my team's last visit to the Division 1.

"How was your game, did you win?"

"We got thumped by the Camels, but we scored three runs."

A minor victory not to be mercied to 0.

In my team's last visit to the Division 1, to maintain team morale and membership, we engaged in a form of softball bingo. Score a run in every game, don't get mercied, score a home run - you get the idea. We could experience the winning feeling that eluded us on the pitch before our inevitable and welcome return to the Division 2. We were frequently first to the pub, but we were a happy team at least.

Division 2 is a competitive and exciting place to play this year but there is a definite cohort of teams who very much don't want to get promoted. Certainly, for my own team we play softball recreationally these days and the gap in standards between the two divisions seems to be

larger than ever. I fear a promotion for us would lead to a raft of retirements and possibly cause the team to fold.

Having played in it in previous years, I'm a big fan of the Playoff Division (see below). It provides a more even competition so that people who strive to be promoted can excel against more challenging opponents. Teams at the lower end of the Division 1 table are not condemned to a winless season without the chance to play teams of a more comparable standard.

Whilst I realise it may cause some scheduling headaches it would help to even out the standards, so it is no longer a bridge too far for some teams.

Bring back the POD!

Ed replies: For those newer players unfamiliar with the POD, it was a league structure whereby Divisions 1 and 2 started the season with nine teams each, then after one rotation the bottom three from Division 1 and the top three from Division 2 formed an intermediate "Playoff Division" for a further two round robins (ten games). The results from the first rotation still counted for the remaining teams in Divisions 1 and 2, but those in the

POD started again from scratch.

I was a big fan of the POD, since it was partly my idea in the first place, and fully understand the reasoning behind the occasional calls for its return. However, I changed my mind a few years ago, for the following reasons:

(a) After only a few results it becomes more or less clear which teams will stay in their original division, and which will move. This means that there are a lot of dead rubbers even in the season's early games.

(b) For the teams that end up in the POD, all the results from their first eight games (half a season's worth) are discarded.

(c) The Division 2 trophy is awarded to the team that effectively came 4th.

(d) Since there is no promotion or relegation (or rather, a promoted team can drop back down into the POD), there is a risk of the same team winning both the POD and Division 2 repeatedly: this happened for three years (2011-13) after which the scheme was abandoned.

(e) (A fifth argument, not entirely the POD's fault) Three leagues of six teams will leave no resting teams to provide umpires on a Wednesday.

Despite this, I would be happy to see the matter discussed. There may be some other solutions. *Harry Somers*
